Presentation

With this number, we complete the fourteen volume of Filosofia Unisinos. The journal started in 1999 and over this period of time we have published more than three hundred original articles and dozens of reviews, giving a relevant contribution to innovative researches in Philosophy, not just in Brazil, but also in Latin America and elsewhere. Starting as a journal dedicated mainly to articles written in Portuguese, Filosofia Unisinos initiated in 2008 to publish preferentially in English following the policy to make it into an international journal of philosophy published in Brazil. Since 2009, the journal has been the single Brazilian journal of Philosophy which is indexed both in Web of Science and Scopus. Therefore, articles published in it are accessible to a world wide audience and theirs authors can easily follow through the H-index factor the impact they have in the international philosophical community. In 2014, the year of the fifteen anniversary of the journal, we will give another important step toward the journal's internationalization. In the next three years, the journal will become a fully international journal of Philosophy based in Brazil, publishing only papers written originally in English. We want to make this process as seamless as possible for those who follow this publication and who contribute to it. As part of this process the journal will receive another denomination, more suitable for its International identification. Therefore, from 2016 onward, Filosofia Unisinos will be called Philosophy South, a name capable of identifying it geographically regarding both Brazil and the world. The goal of this final movement toward internationalization remains the same that has motivated us at the beginning of it in 2008, namely, to facilitate the dialogue between the Brazilian and Latin-American philosophical community with its peers abroad. English has become even more crucial to this dialogue along the last decade. It is crucial for two of the biggest philosophical communities in the world, which are the Brazilian and the Latin-American, to be able to communicate among itself and with others in this new lingua franca of science. Alongside with this transition to a exclusively English written journal, our team will offer to its contributors and readers a consistent policy to keep it accessible to non-native English speakers. Another guidelines for publications in the journal will be announced during the next year. As the editor of Filosofia Unisinos, I would like to thank you, authors and readers of this journal, for your support along all these years. May we deserve your confidence also during this transition and beyond.
